



SCAMS



Scams cost Australians millions of dollars each year.

Anyone can be targeted!

Scams are a common way that cyber criminals compromise your online accounts. Scammers' goal is to trick you into paying money or giving away your personal information. They will use email, text messages, phone calls or social media, and often pretend to be a person or organisation you trust.

Knowing what the common types of scams are, and what to look out for could save you from becoming a victim.

ABSENCE FROM RESIDENCE

You can be away from your home for many reasons.

Letting police know is a proactive way you can help keep your home and community safe.

This is even more important if you'll be away a long time.

When you register with police, you provide:

- Your contact information.
- Times and dates you'll be away.
- Who to contact while you're away.

Police stations have an *absence from residence* register.

This information could be used to reach you or your emergency contact if there is an incident at your home or to perform patrols in the area.

Due to the dynamic nature of calls for police services, Victoria Police cannot guarantee that police will attend your property during your absence from your home.

Be sure to notify police if returning earlier than planned.

REGISTER ONLINE

To register your absence from residence online, visit https://service.vic.gov.au/find-services/housing-and-property/register-your-absence-from-residence

You can also register at your local police station. To do so, download and complete the absence from residence form: https://www.police.vic.gov.au/home-and-property#absence-from-residence

Take the completed form to your local police station to be noted in the station's register.





HOW TO PROTECT YOUR HOME WHEN YOU GO AWAY

If you're going on holiday, making your home look occupied when you're not there is a good way to put off unwanted intruders.

Most break-ins happen when there's no-one home. Before you go away, take time to secure your home and reduce the chance a thief breaking in by following these simple tips.

LOCK UP

Make sure all doors and windows are shut and locked, including sheds, garages and gates.

Remove any spare keys you have hidden outside the home and keep any spares out of sight inside the house.

DON'T BROADCAST YOUR HOLIDAY

Don't announce on social media that you're going away. You can post your holiday snaps once you've safely returned home.

Set your social media accounts to "private" or "friends only" and delete any followers you don't know.

MAKE IT SEEM LIKE YOU'RE AT HOME

Get timer switches for your lights and radio or television, if you don't have smart home technology. Set them to turn on and off at times of the day when you would normally use them.

Make sure the lights come on in the living areas of your home, and not in the hallway, for example. Tuning your radio to a station which is mostly talking is better than a music station.

ASK A NEIGHBOUR TO HELP

Ask a neighbour you trust to keep an eye on your property and help make it look like you're there. Tell them when you're going and when you'll be back. Ask them to:

- park their car in your driveway to make it look like you're at home
- clear out your letterbox
- open and close blinds at appropriate times of the day
- put your garbage bins out on collection day and bring them in again.

CANCEL DELIVERIES

Cancel any regular deliveries such as newspapers and food boxes and arrange for Australia Post to hold or redirect your mail.

LIGHT UP WITH SENSOR LIGHTS

Install motion sensor lights around the entry to your home if you don't already have them.

Before you head off, test that they're working and angled correctly. Consider getting solar-powered sensor lights.

CONSIDER A SMART CAMERA

While most security cameras are more useful for catching crooks than deterring them, installing camera doorbells or motion sensor cameras disguised as floodlights can come in handy when you're not home.

Invest in the models that link with your smartphone, so if you do have an intruder at home

you'll receive a notification and can even see and talk to them in real time.

Hang some washing on your line and bring it in again.

REDIRECT MAIL

Arrange for Australia Post to hold or redirect your mail. Put a "no junk mail" sticker on your letterbox.
