#### Update from Member for Bellarine Alison Marchant

There are many great announcements from the recent 2026/27 State Budget to share with the Bellarine community.

From Monday 1 June to Friday 31 July 2026, you can apply for a 20% rebate on your vehicle registration payments. This will save up to \$186 per vehicle on the 2025-26 vehicle registrations, and the rebate will be available for up to 2 light vehicles per person.

Applications will open from Monday 1 June via the Service Vic app or website. Throughout June and July, there will be a series of mobile offices across the Bellarine to receive assistance in applying for your rebate. Find out more about where the mobile offices will be located via my website

In addition to this rebate, after free public transport in April and May, fares will now be reduced to half price for the remainder of the year. Public transport will remain free for people under 18, and free on weekends for Victorian Seniors Card holders, carers, and Disability Support Pension recipients.

These measures are designed to ease cost-of-living pressures while encouraging more people to make use of our public transport network.

I am also proud to share that we will be introducing a cross Bellarine bus service from Drysdale to Ocean Grove!

I am so pleased to have been able to secure funding in the 2026/27 State Budget for this service. It has been a journey – from petitions to meetings with community groups, to inviting the Minister to the Bellarine to see our bus routes firsthand and finally securing a Bus Review to hear exactly from the community what they are after, this announcement has been years in the making.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who participated in the Bellarine Bus Review throughout March and April this year. The review formed part of a broader assessment of bus services across the Geelong, Bannockburn, and Bellarine region. Notably, 44% of all responses came from the Bellarine, highlighting how strongly our community cares about improving local transport.

The introduction of a cross Bellarine service is just one outcome of the review, and there will be more information to come, but for now this is a great win for our community following years of advocacy.

## Police Reservist – Frontline Support Officers



Victoria Police have created a position for former members with at least two years of service to return as a Police Reservist.

This initiative is to help free up valuable frontline members and have Police Reservist support them with station-based duties as a Frontline Support Officer.

The role of a Frontline Support Officer (police reservist) will consist of answering phones, assisting with enquiries, taking reports and supporting case preparation.

Frontline Support Officers will be rostered on eight-hour shifts on weekdays and are entitled to nine weeks of recreational leave.

Reception duties consume over 1.4million frontline hours each year. With the assistance of a Reservist taking on these tasks they will give frontline members more time on the road to assist with the community and crime prevention.

There have been over 450 former police members already express their interest.

This opportunity is also available to other Australian jurisdictions, as well as those who have served in New Zealand or the United Kingdom.

## CRIME STOPPERS VICTORIA

Crime Stoppers is an independent not-for-profit organisation that partners with the community, media and police to encourage people to prevent crime and to confidentially share what they know about unsolved crime or suspicious activity.

Crime Stoppers believes everyone has the right to feel safe from crime. We share practical advice on how you can protect your community, and the people and things that are important to you.

When you make a report, you don't have to leave your personal details with us, your call isn't recorded and, if you make a report online, your IP address isn't stored. You are in control of the reporting process – you choose how much information you share and whether you want to remain anonymous.

Since its start in Victoria in 1987, they have received over 1.33 million tips from the community, resulting in over 27,600 arrests and the recovery of more than \$406 million worth of drugs, property and cash.

## OPERATION EARLY BIRD COMMENCES ACROSS THE BELLARINE

Bellarine Police are currently assisting the Geelong Highway Patrol as part of **Operation Early Bird** a targeted road policing operation focusing on dangerous driving behaviours during the early morning hours.

As the name suggests, the operation is aimed at intercepting motorists during the early part of the day, with police targeting offences including speeding, red light infringements and other risky driving behaviour that places road users at risk.

The operation officially commenced today, 25<sup>TH</sup> of May, with police already intercepting 12 vehicles and issuing 13 electronic penalty infringement notices (ePins).

Police are reminding all motorists that road safety enforcement can occur anytime and anywhere, with operations such as these designed to help reduce road trauma and keep the community safe.

Drivers are encouraged to slow down, obey traffic signals and remain alert while travelling on our roads.



Victoria Police officially launched a 24-hour police assistance phone line and online reporting service for the community to connect with about non-urgent crimes and events. All Victorians are encouraged to contact the Police Assistance Line on 131 444 or visit the Victoria Police Online Reporting service to report non-urgent crimes and events. The Police Assistance Line and Online Reporting service will take reports or give advice at any time on non-urgent crimes and events anywhere in the state, including:

- property damage
- lost or located property
- theft
- absence from residence registrations
- PartySafe registrations
- other general non-urgent police enquiries

The Online Reporting service is available through the new look Victoria Police website, which improves the way police information and services are found and understood online

The Police assistance Line calls are taken by civilian staff at a contact centre in Ballarat, under the supervision of police.

#### WARNING TRADIES!

Thieves are targeting utes and trailers, often going for what's visible or not secured.

We encourage you to take extra steps to secure your gear - perhaps removing very valuable tools and storing in the garage.

There's a strong market for second hand tools so try making your tools harder to resell by making them as unattractive as possible.

★ Get an "All Tools Are Marked and Tracked" sticker for your ute, van or trailer from Neighbourhood Watch Bellarine or from BELLARINE, PORTARLINGTON, WAURN PONDS OR GEELONG POLICE STATIONS or message us here.

★ Clearly marking or engraving your ID details on tools will make them much harder for thieves to resell, easier for you to report and recover, and more likely to discourage theft in the first place. Neighbourhood Watch recommend that, for the best chance of recovery, you mark your tools with 'V' followed by your driver's licence number i.e. V123456.

★ Ultra violet pens are available from Neighbourhood Watch – message us here to purchase.

★ Mark them with bright spray paint, stickers and electrical tape to put off potential buyers.

★ Removing or covering the tool brand name and brand colours will also help devalue the item.

★ If you have your tools registered on Property Vault <https://www.propertyvault.com.au>, you can mark them as stolen if they get nicked.

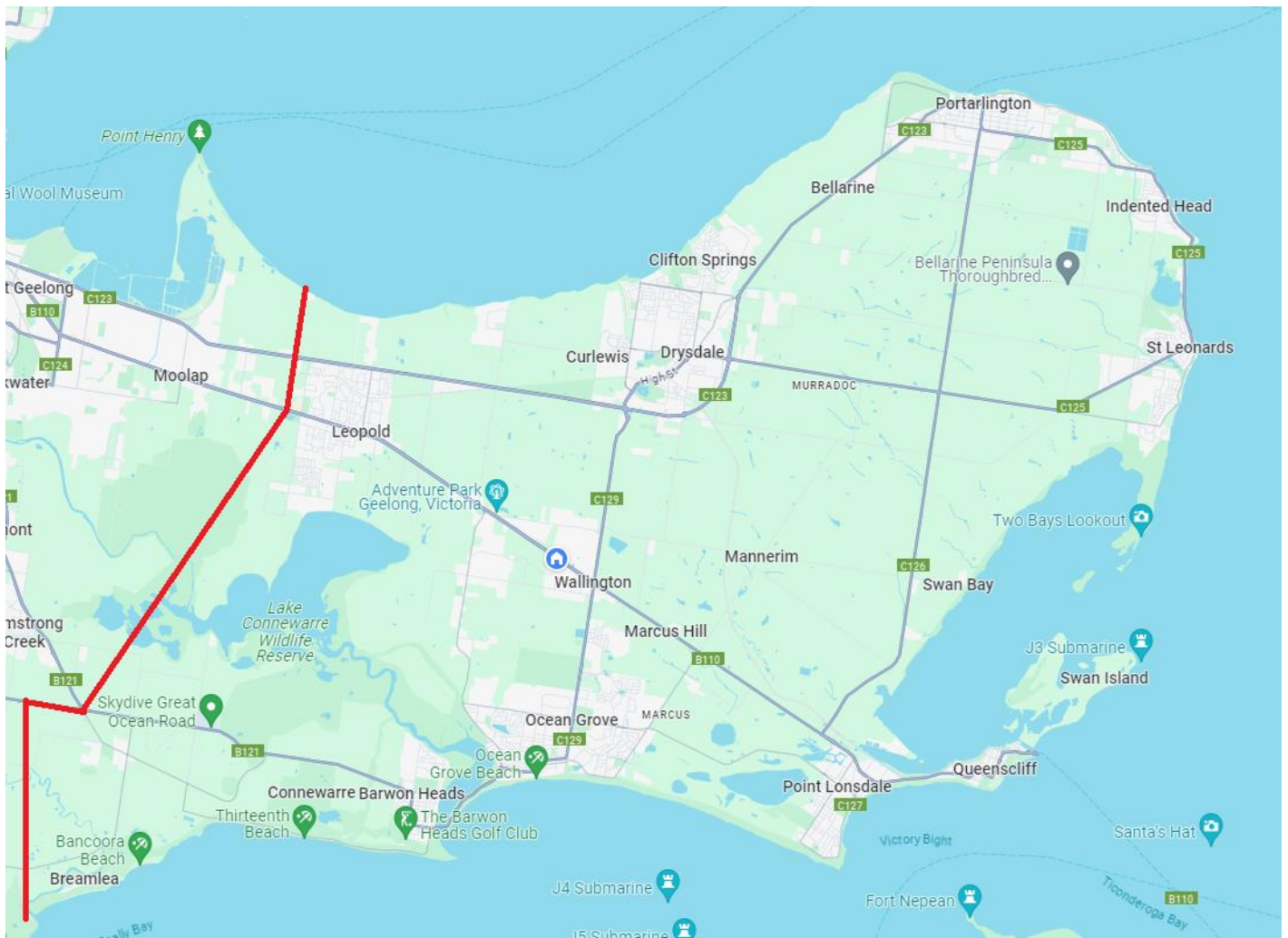
